





EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

In 2024, Superatec reaffirmed its commitment to social development by implementing projects that provide sustainable solutions to the challenges faced by diverse communities.

This report highlights the programs carried out during the year, aligned with our institutional mission and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), contributing to educational, productive, and social transformation in the regions where we operate.

Education

Applied Electronics and Entrepreneurship Program









Purpose: To promote STEM learning and technical skills through hands-on electronic projects.



Outcomes: Prototypes included a Smart Plug (to prevent electrical damage) and a Water Level Monitor (for safe water tank management).

This initiative ran from October 2023 to July 2024. Here are two examples of innovative projects developed by participants:

Smart Plug: A power socket designed to protect electronic devices from electrical damage. This device automatically cuts off power when it detects service instability.


 Water Level Monitor: A system that helps households and businesses monitor water levels in tanks, activating, deactivating, and maintaining the system efficiently— without the need for a floating sensor.






Technology, Electronics, and Educational Robotics **Program**


